Students must submit qualifying report within the specific qualifying period. After completing Qualifying period, students must submit annual progress report on an annual basis until they have submitted the final version of their thesis for oral examination and have completed any other programme requirements.

In addition, during year 2 of their study, they are required to deliver a presentation regarding their thesis plan and answer questions from their panel members and other attendees.
